Prepare our pupils for the responsibility and experiences of adult life to enable them to develop as well rounded members of society.





1. Children must be in school for registration at 9.15am.




2. Children must go to school every day.





# Helpful Information for new P.1 Pupils.

#### First Day—A happy One!

Be positive with your child in preparing them for school. Explain what will happen re. teacher, breaks, new friends, lunch-time and home-time.

On arrival show your child where to hang their coat and leave their lunch. This is clearly labelled in the Parent's area as you enter the school.

After your child has met the teacher and some friends, parents are advised to leave promptly as children can quickly pick up on anxiety. Most children, even if initially upset soon become distracted by their surroundings and settle down.

#### Curriculum

Your child will be following the Foundation Stage in P1 and P2. The Foundation stage is based upon the belief that young children learn best when learning is interactive, practical and enjoyable for both children and teachers. For more information visit the website

#### **Information Letters**

#### **Food**

Our school operates a healthy break policy which encourages healthy eating.

#### **Your Child's Progress**

Before the end of term one, you will be asked to attend a parent teacher interview to discuss your child's progress. Please do not hesitate to approach the teacher at any time if there is sometime you feel anxious about. Formal written reports are sent out at the end of the Summer Term. There are no formal tests in the Foundation Stage and progress is measured with careful observations made by the class teacher and assistants.

#### **Distribution Of Medicines**

Teachers will not distribute any form of medicine to children while in school. In exceptional circumstances parents must give written permission to the Principal if they require their child to be given medicine or use inhalers.

#### **Uniform**

Children wear the school uniform every day. We have spare uniforms in case any child has any toilet problems. Please inform the teacher if your child has any difficulty with toileting and send in a spare set of clothing for emergencies.

Please label any item of clothing your child wears in, including hats, scarves, jumpers, as many children own similar items.

#### **Toys**

There is no need for children to bring toys into school as breakages do happen. The school is well equipped with fun, attractive educational games for your child to enjoy.

#### **Health and Safety**

As part of our school's health programme we encourage regular washing of hands, particularly around eating time and toilet use. Unfortunately colds and other little bugs spread quickly in a classroom environment so children are encouraged to use a tissue when blowing their nose and cover their mouth when sneezing or coughing. Reinforcing these behaviours at home always helps. If your child does become ill with any contagious illness such as chicken pox, we would ask that you keep them at home until they recover. We recommend that you check your child's hair for head lice regularly and if they occur inform the teacher so other parents are warned of possible risk. All information regarding your child's health is treated in the strictest confidence.

#### **Homework**

As the year progresses your child will have some exercises to complete at home. These activities will be short and sitting with your child for these fiveten will reinforce concepts taught in school.

#### **Bedtime**

A well rested pupil is a pupil ready to learn. Please make sure your child goes to bed early.

#### **Preparation for Primary 1**

Good writing is all about muscle and motor control so it will help your child greatly if they are practised at colouring, drawing, cutting, painting, manipulating materials such as plasticene, construction work, jigsaws, etc. Noting visual differences is essential to reading and this skill is practised and encouraged by use of matching games, construction work, jigsaws, etc. Learning Nursery rhymes will help with learning sounds and are key pre-reading skills. Reading aloud to your child will cultivate an interest in and love of reading. Talking to your child and asking questions about stories will aid concentration and improve vocabulary.


#### **Home Time**

All P1 children go home at 2.20pm. Pupils can be collected at the door at the side of the school building. Please come promptly as your child may fret if they think they have been forgotten. If there are any special collection arrangements please inform the teacher by note or telephone message.

#### Road Safety/Car park

Children are taught road safety throughout the school. Please help us reinforce the rules of the road and personal safety, such as never talking to strangers. Please drive slowly and park responsibly when within the school grounds. There can be a lot of people around cars at home time and care and courtesy is needed. Parents/Guardians are asked to walk their child to and from the school from their car using the designated footpaths.
