## **BREAKFAST CLUB – MORNING ARRANGEMENTS from Mon 7/9/2020**

Dear Parent/Guardian

Our school has had a successful reopening this week as our pupils have embraced our new school day arrangements and returned with enthusiasm and optimism after such a long absence. I thank you all for following our instructions on drop off and pick up times and cooperating with us as we follow the guidelines in ensuring a safe return for all staff and pupils.

We intend to reopen our Breakfast club next week and like many other activities this will be operated following the new guidelines relating to class bubbles.

<u>The Breakfast club will be available for P1 to P7 pupils only.</u> Unfortunately, our Nursery pupils will be unable to attend. This will be reviewed after Halloween.

<u>8.45am.</u> Time is required after the last service to clean the hall. Pupils can arrive from 8.15-8.45am if they wish to receive Breakfast.

At 9.00am, pupils will go to their classrooms where their teachers will be supervising.

Our dinner hall will be used for the Breakfast club as usual and pupils will enter through the main front doors. Pupils must sit at their designated class table only.

The food on offer includes - Cereal, toast, scones, pancakes and fruit. Drinks include milk, orange juice or water. **Cost per child £1** 

Only children who attend the breakfast club can be onsite before 9am. There is no supervision for pupils who arrive before this time.

All other pupils not attending the Breakfast club can be dropped off between 9.00am and 9.15am.

Numbers who can attend our Breakfast club are limited and at this stage there is no need to pre-book the service. This may be necessary in the future if numbers are larger than expected.

These new arrangements are in place so we can offer a Breakfast club. To ensure that the morning arrangements in place are safe for all, parents must not drop off their children at school before 9am if they are not attending the Breakfast club as there is no supervision available.
